



US 120496: PROVIDE RISK-BASED PRIMARY EMERGENCY CARE/FIRST AID IN THE WORKPLACE

NQF Level 05 | Credits 5

Description

This Unit Standard will be useful for employees to enable them to provide primary emergency care (first aid) in response to an occupational risk induced or any health emergency in their specific workplaces.

Specific Outcomes

Qualifying learners are able to:

- Demonstrate the principles of primary emergency care.
- Assess and control a single injury emergency scene in the workplace.
- Demonstrate primary emergency life support for adults, children, and infants.
- Explain and manage shock.
- Carry out secondary assessment of the sick or injured person and provide appropriate primary emergency care at the scene.
- Keep records of the incident/accident.

Learning Assumed to Be in Place and Recognition of Prior Learning

- Communication at NQF Level 1 or ABET Level 4.
- Mathematical Literacy at NQF Level 1.

Entry Requirements

In order for the learner to achieve this unit standard the learner must already be competent in:

- US 14656: "Demonstrate an understanding of sexuality and sexually transmitted infections including HIV/AIDS".

Duration

- **Phase 1:** Contact Classroom / Blended Learning – **2 days**.
- **Phase 2:** Own Pace, On-the-job learning, Self-directed learning, Coaching, and Other training.
- **Phase 3:** Submission and evaluation of Portfolio of Evidence and resubmission, if required.
- **Phase 4:** Summative Assessment and Final Practical Evaluation – **1 day**.

Certification

Subject to final internal moderation, all successful learners will be issued with a *Certificate of Attendance* and once the verification and endorsement have been completed by a SAQA approved Quality Assurance Partner (QAP), a *Statement of Results (SOR)* and *Competency Certificate (CC)* will be issued by them and distributed through BLS Medical.

Please note: The time frame for issuing for the SOR and CC is reliant on the QAPs verification and endorsement of the training conducted. There may be a delay despite BLS Medical requesting that this to be done as soon as the final internal moderation has been completed.

Course Dates and Training Venues
